Earlier this year the valley lost one of its greatest characters.

John Common was 98 when he died and had attended more than 80 Harbottle Shows, only missing those whilst serving in the Coldstream Guards. It is also believed that John was the last WW2 veteran in the valley.

As a long standing committee member of the Show, John served as Treasurer for many years along side Show Chairmen Tommy Logan, Bobby Edmondson and John Rayner. He was also Show President from 2013 to 2018 and a great supporter of the Show providing the perfect setting in Oak Tree Field on his farm. He was a man of many talents: farmer, postman, school car driver, as well as serving his country during the war years. Those who knew him well will fondly remember his recollections of valley life and great sense of humour.

More recently, April Common wife of George and daughter in law of John lost her battle with cancer. April was another great supporter of the show and served on the committee for many years. With a great sense of humour and personality. She will be sadly missed.




